HUNTING AREA

Situated in the northern reaches of the Limpopo Province, this unique reserve has been our stomping grounds for decades. Owned and run by close family friends who are pioneers in the conservation arena, Kuduland remains one of the largest hunting reserves in Limpopo, providing an unmatched wilderness experience anywhere in the country. Terrain within the reserve varies considerably between semi-desert flats, Mopani thickets and rocky outcrops, making it one of the most aesthetic and diverse areas in the country. The chance to see numerous big 5 species on your safari makes it the perfect destination for non-hunting family members to join while you pursue buffalo and plains game species.

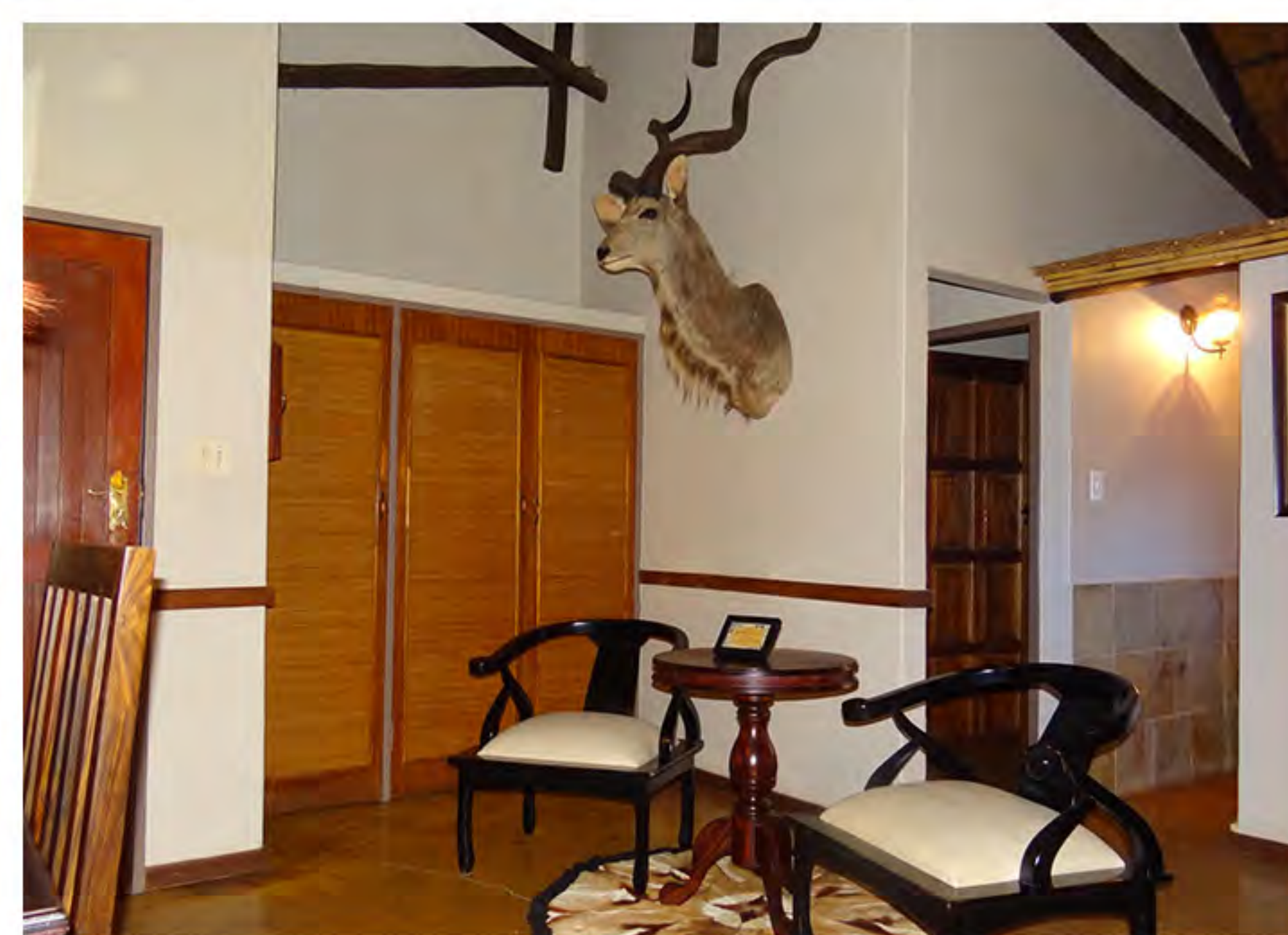
In addition to the main reserve, our privately owned Ingwe Conservancy remains our best kept secret. Situated in the nearby Soutpansberg Mountains, this oasis in the bushveld boasts breathtaking scenery, unique terrains and specialized species such as the elusive Red Duiker, monster Klipspringer, Limpopo Bushbuck, and some nocturnal critters.



ACCOMMODATIONS

The hunting lodge is a quintessential hunting camp as it were in the 80's yet provides all the modern-day amenities and more to enjoy an unforgettable African experience. The three thatched chalets can sleep up to 10 guests sharing. Features include an indoor dining room, a game viewing deck overlooking the nearby waterhole, an open-air lounge and dining area, Wi-Fi, swimming pool for the warmer months, and of course a traditional fireplace to enjoy cocktails and outdoor dining.

DAILY RATES INCLUDE:

- Meet & greet at nearest international airport.
- Camp accommodations during the safari. Rooms are cleaned daily, and laundry done regularly.
- Licensed professional hunter with equipped hunting vehicle.
- Skinners, trackers, and camp staff.
- Locally sourced soft drinks, juices, and bottled water.
- Locally sourced alcoholic beverages in moderation.
- All meals (breakfast, lunch, dinner) and snacks.

DAILY RATES DO NOT INCLUDE:

- All international and domestic flights, air and road charters, travel visas & airport taxes.
- Accommodation before & after the safari.
- All insurances, including but not limited to: Medical evacuation, trip cancellation, trophies, personal belongings and personal health.
- All trophy fees. Animals that are wounded and not found will incur 15% Value Added Tax.
- Taxidermy, dipping, packing & collection of trophies.
- Staff gratuities.
- Additional transfers between areas and side excursions.

Limited offtake quotas are allocated each year. Species marked * require CITES or TOPS permits to be applied for 30 days in advance. Please indicate your species preference list well in advance to avoid disappointment.



TERMS AND CONDITIONS

BOOKING CONDITIONS:

All prices are subject to change without prior notice. No safari is considered reserved until the required deposit is paid. Travelers checks and VISA cards will not be accepted. All transfers to be paid in US Dollars by wire transfer only. Any other payment agreement must be authorized in writing.

- **Daily Rate Hunts:** \$1,000 per person non-refundable deposit required to secure safari dates. Outstanding "Daily Rates" and any "Additional Costs" to be paid 60 days prior to arrival date. Total "Trophy Fees" and additionally incurred costs are required at the end of the safari.
- **Package Hunts:** 50% non-refundable deposit required to secure package. Outstanding 50% and any "Additional Costs" required 60 days prior to arrival. Any additional "trophy Fees" and additionally incurred costs to be paid at the end of the hunt.

CANCELLATION POLICY:

- Due to limited hunting dates and quota availability, as well as fair payment timeframes, all above mentioned deposits are non-refundable.
- Should a client postpone to the following year, the daily rate deposit will only be rolled over to the following year if a replacement can be booked.
- Government and third-party related fees, such as license fees, permits, road transfers, and air charters etc. will not be refunded whatsoever.
- It is highly recommended to take out trip cancellation insurance for all guests.

INDEMNITY, INSURANCE & CLIENT CONTRACT:

- All safari activities are potentially dangerous, and all lawful directions of the company's directors, associates, and/or staff must be followed. The company, its directors, staff, and associates will not be held responsible for any individual's negligence, loss, illness, damage, delays, or accident before, during or after the safari, or for any costs incurred as a result thereof.
- It is the clients' responsibility to arrange their own travel, medical, evacuation or personal insurances. 'Ripcord Comprehensive Travel Protection' and 'Global Rescue' are commonly used by the hunting fraternity.
- Each client is advised to seek advice from their doctor regarding personal first aid, necessary prescriptions and medications.
- Upon booking, all clients will be required to complete and sign the visitors contract, which includes a client information form, indemnity form, and pre-amble, before the safari begins.

PERMITS AND LICENSING:

Each hunter may require a hunting license or permit issued in their name by the respective country or province's legal authority. Species marked * require CITES and/or TOPS permits. We will obtain these on the hunter's behalf however they should be applied for well in advance to avoid disappointment. Clients must apply for their own CITES or relevant animal import permits into their home country.

PROTOCOLS & REGULATIONS:

Certain species may at any time be unavailable to hunt without prior notice. Due to small quota allocations on certain species, clients are requested to enquire and reserve animals to avoid disappointment. Shooting from or near vehicles and buildings is prohibited. Hunting will be conducted on foot, or from dedicated hides where permitted. All weapons will be sighted on the range before hunt commences. Alcohol consumption will not be permitted whilst hunting or handling firearms.



SAFARI INFO

ENTRY AND VISA REQUIREMENTS

Travelers into South Africa must have a passport that is: valid until six months after the departure date of travel, has at least one blank page for endorsements, a valid visa if required, a return or onward ticket, and a yellow fever certificate if your journey starts or passes through yellow fever regions. Requirements for visitors' visas differ from country to country and are subject to change. Visas are not issued at all countries' ports of entry, and all visitors must check with their nearest consulate about entry regulations and obtaining a visa.

FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION

A temporary import/export permit is required to bring any firearms into South Africa. Although permits can be issued on arrival, it is advisable to apply before travelling to avoid delays and complications. Each hunter is permitted to enter South Africa with a maximum of 4x firearms and a maximum of 200 rounds of ammunition per firearm. Be advised that dangerous game species adhere to minimum caliber requirements. It is advisable to take out full insurance for all firearms before travelling anywhere in Africa. Ensure that your ammunition is in a separate lockable container from your firearm. Should a client not wish to bring their own firearm, camp rifles and ammunition are available at additional costs indicated in the price lists.

BOW HUNTING

Bow hunting is legal in most of our provinces. While pachyderms and certain dangerous game species are prohibited to hunt with a bow, Buffalo and plains game species are legal. Be advised that we adhere to the following minimum requirements for bow hunts.

- Broadheads: No mechanical broadheads.
- Arrows: Plains Game 500 grain. Buffalo & Giraffe 750 grain
- Long: Plains Game 60lb. Buffalo & Giraffe 80lb
- Recurve: Plains Game 55lbs. Buffalo & Giraffe 75lbs
- Compound: Plains Game 50lbs. Buffalo & Giraffe 75lbs

HEALTH AND TRAVEL INSURANCE

It is the clients' own responsibility to take out their own travel, evacuation, medical, personal, and related insurances. "Ripcord Comprehensive Travel Protection" and "Global Rescue" are commonly used by the hunting fraternity. Each client is advised to seek advice from their doctor regarding a personal first aid kit and necessary prescriptions and preferred medications.

TROPHY PREPERATION

Skinning of trophies is included in our daily rates. Field preparations, documentation and transport of trophies to the local export agent and taxidermy will be indicated in the quotation and contract. Trophy dipping, taxidermy work, packing and shipping will be charged directly by the local export agent and taxidermy. We typically make use of Splitting Image Taxidermy and Life Form Taxidermy.



PACKING LIST

We have compiled a packing recommendation based on previous clients' experiences to assist you with your travel preparations. Laundry is typically done daily in most hunting camps, subject to weather conditions.

- 3x T-shirts
- 3x long sleeve shirts (khaki or olive)
- 2x pairs of comfortable shorts
- 2x pairs of cotton trousers
- 1x fleece / sweatshirt
- 5x pairs of socks and underwear
- 1x belt
- 1x hat and/or cap
- Swimsuit for camps with pools.
- Lightweight and durable walking/hunting boots – preferably worn in.
- Comfortable shoes for camp and travels.
- Additional clothes for colder months May-August: Warm padded jacket, gloves, beanie, buff, long underwear.
- Hunting Gear: Camera, knife, ammunition belt, binoculars, hunting backpack, flashlight, headlight, soft ankle gaiters, soft rifle case or sleeve, rifle bore rope.
- Personal Documents: Passport, airline tickets, firearm documents, initiation letters, hotel reservations, emergency contact list, and copies of all documents
- Toiletries and Medication: Please note that we recommend consulting with your personal doctor regarding products. Malaria prophylactics for select areas, sunscreen, insect repellent ("Skin so Soft" by Avon has worked well for previous guests), prescription medication if applicable, small personal first aid kit, and general toiletries such as toothpaste, toothbrush, hairbrush, shampoo, soap, clippers, etc.
- Personal Items: Cash (2009 or newer), sunglasses & reading glasses, phone and charger, laptop or tablet and charger, charger adapter (220V), reading material, etc.
